- For Manawatu-Wanganui Region as a whole, there are 85,194 occupied dwellings.

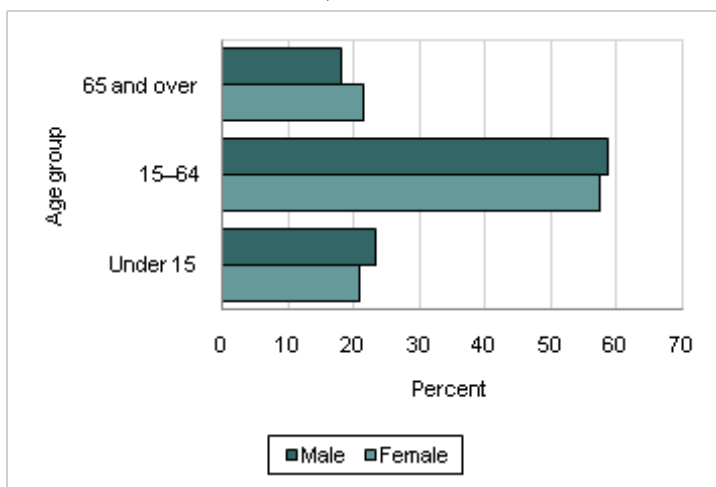

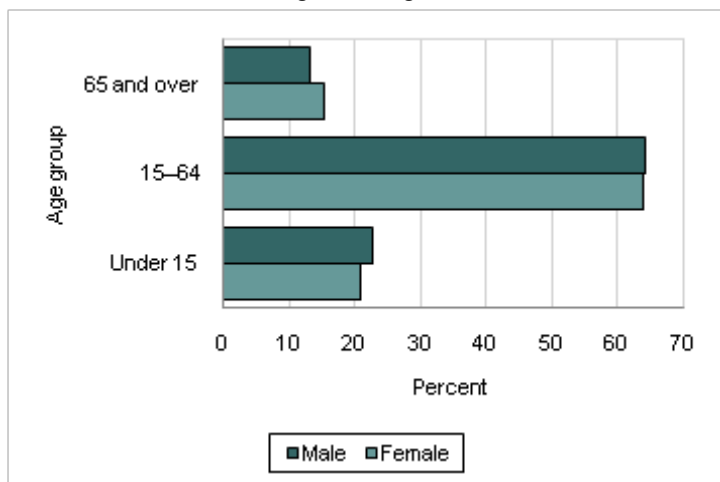
Total population

- 19.9 percent of people in Marton are aged 65 years and over, compared with 14.3 percent of the total Manawatu-Wanganui Region population.
- 22.1 percent of people are aged under 15 years in Marton, compared with 21.8 percent for all of Manawatu-Wanganui Region.

Birthplace

- 10.4 percent of people in Marton were born overseas, compared with 12.6 percent for Manawatu-Wanganui Region as a whole.
- For people born overseas who are now living in Marton, the most common birthplace was the UK and Ireland, compared with the UK and Ireland for all of Manawatu-Wanganui Region.

Languages spoken

- English is the most commonly spoken language in Marton.
- 8.6 percent of people in Marton speak Māori, compared with 5.5 percent of people for all of Manawatu-Wanganui Region.
- New Zealand Sign Language is used by 1.0 percent of people in Marton, compared with 0.9 percent of people for all of Manawatu-Wanganui Region.
- 87.6 percent of people in Marton speak only one language, compared with 86.3 percent of people for all of Manawatu-Wanganui Region.

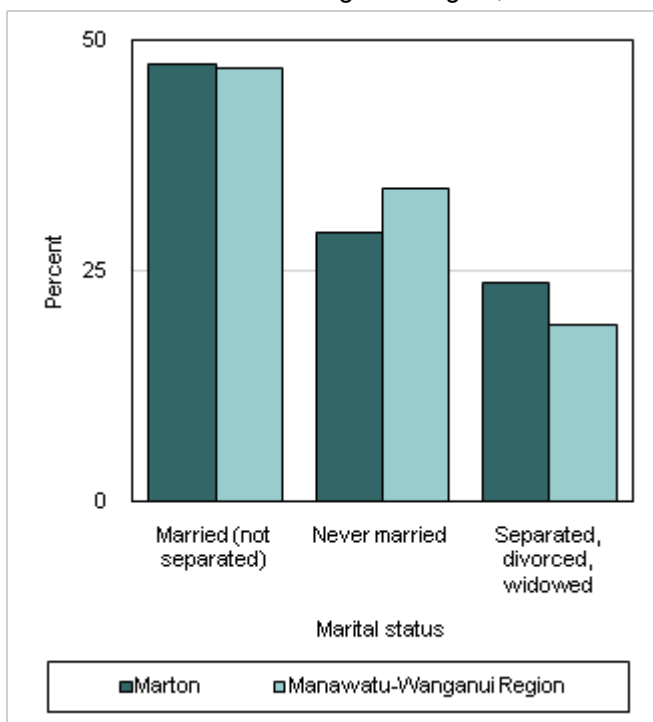
Marital Status

Total population aged 15 years and over

- 29.1 percent of people aged 15 years and over living in Marton have never married, 47.3 percent are married, and 23.6 percent are separated, divorced or widowed.
- 26.8 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Marton who have never married, live with a partner.

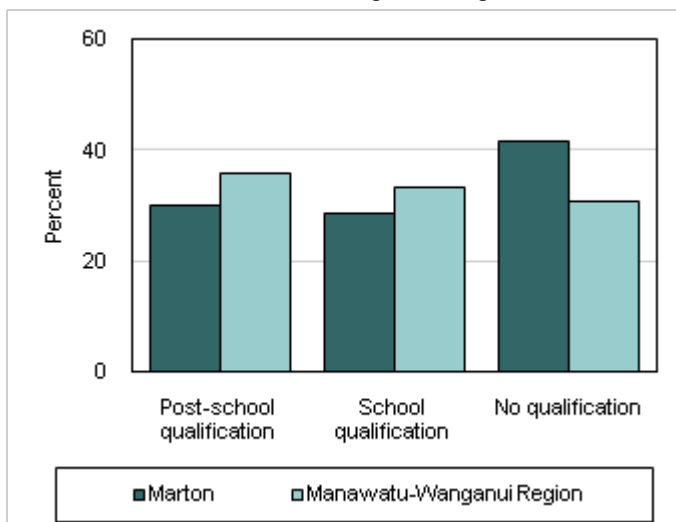
Education

Total population aged 15 years and over

- 29.9 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Marton have a post-school qualification, compared with 35.7 percent of people throughout Manawatu-Wanganui Region.
- In Marton, 41.6 percent of people aged 15 years and over have no formal qualifications, compared with 30.9 percent for Manawatu-Wanganui Region as a whole.

Work

Total population aged 15 years and over

- The unemployment rate in Marton is 6.4 percent for people aged 15 years and over, compared with 5.2 percent for all of Manawatu-Wanganui Region.
- The most common occupational group in Marton is 'Labourers' and 'Managers' is the most common occupational group in Manawatu-Wanganui Region.

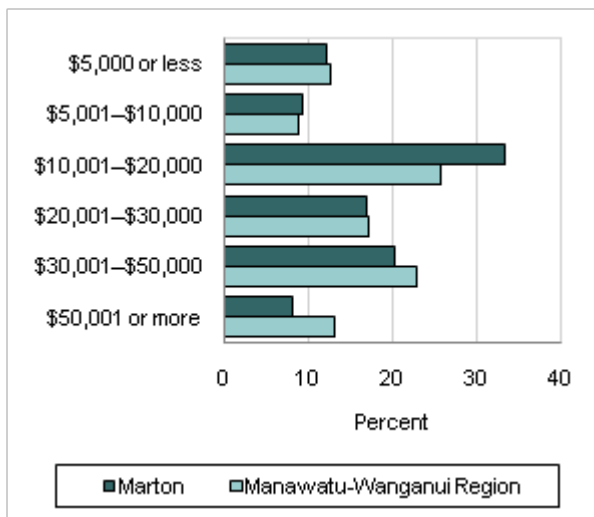
Income

Total population aged 15 years and over

- For people aged 15 years and over, the median income (half earn more, and half less, than this amount) in Marton is \$18,100. This compares with a median of \$21,600 for all of Manawatu-Wanganui Region.
- 54.9 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Marton have an annual income of \$20,000 or less, compared with 47.2 percent of people for Manawatu-Wanganui Region as a whole.
- In Marton, 8.0 percent of people aged 15 years and over have an annual income of more than \$50,000, compared with 13.0 percent of people in Manawatu-Wanganui Region.

Families

- Couples with children make up 33.8 percent of all families in Marton, while couples without children make up 45.3 percent of all families.
- In Manawatu-Wanganui Region, couples with children make up 38.7 percent of all families, while couples without children make up 41.6 percent of all families.
- 20.9 percent of families in Marton are one-parent-with-children families, compared with 19.7 percent of families for Manawatu-Wanganui Region as a whole.

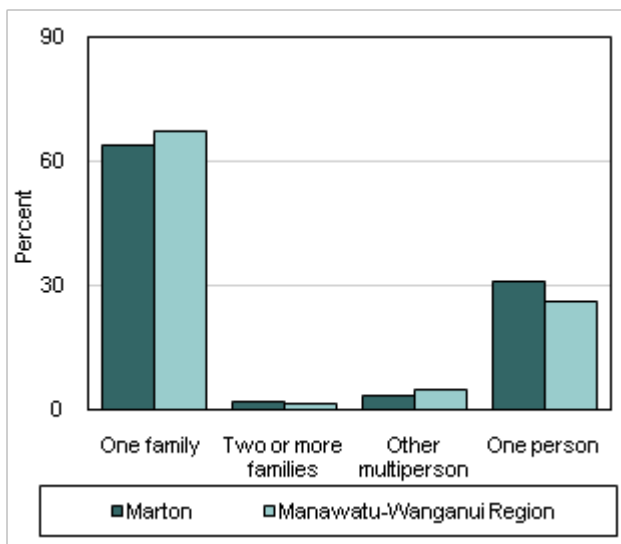

Households

- One-family households make up 63.7 percent of all households in Marton. For Manawatu-Wanganui Region as a whole, one-family households make up 67.4 percent of all households.
- 567 people (or 30.9 percent) live in one-person households in Marton. Throughout Manawatu-Wanganui Region, one-person households make up 26.1 percent of all households.
- The average household size in Marton is 2.4 people, compared with an average of 2.5 people for all of Manawatu-Wanganui Region.

Phones, net & fax

Households

- 48.1 percent of households in Marton have access to the Internet, compared with 54.4 percent of households throughout Manawatu-Wanganui Region.
- In Marton 68.3 percent of households have access to a cellphone, compared with 71.2 percent of households for Manawatu-Wanganui Region as a whole.

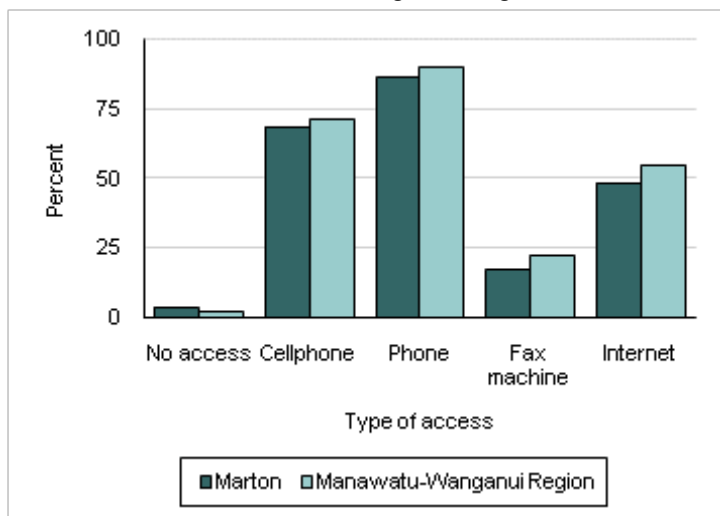

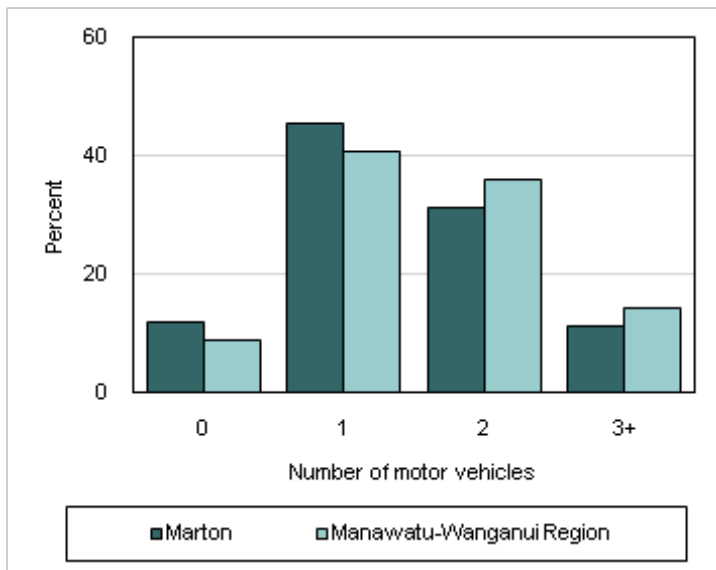
Transport

Household access to motor vehicles

- 11.2 percent of households in Marton have access to three or more motor vehicles, compared with 14.3 percent of all households in Manawatu-Wanganui Region.

Main means of travel to work

- Excluding driving a private car, truck or van, the second most common means of travel to work on census day for people in Marton was driving a company car, truck or van. For Manawatu-Wanganui Region as a whole, the second most common means of travel to work was driving a company car, truck or van.

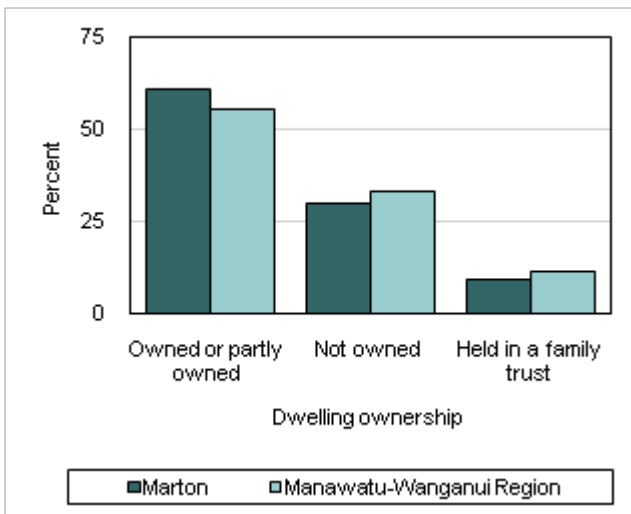

Housing

- In Marton, 61.0 percent of households in private occupied dwellings own the dwelling, with or without a mortgage.
- For Manawatu-Wanganui Region as a whole, 55.2 percent of households in private occupied dwellings own the dwelling, with or without a mortgage.
